

## How to refill defects with E-Z Flow™ stick, electric knife and Wool-Lube® rubbing lubricant

## The following instructions describe how to touch up and repair the most common damages furniture.

## **Procedure:**

- Damaged area must be clean and free of dirt. Use a blade or sandpaper to remove any loose fibers.
- Choose the closest colour E-Z Flow<sup>™</sup> stick. Melt enough E-Z Flow<sup>™</sup> stick on the hot blade of the Burn-in knife to slightly overfill the damage. **Fig. 1**
- Allow the melted stick material to flow into the damage, overfilling slightly. Fig. 2
- Wipe any axcess carefully from the blade with a clean cloth. Fig. 3
- Apply Burn-in Balm<sup>™</sup> paste generously to the area surrounding the repair.
- Use the hot knife blade to level the E-Z Flow™ stick fill. Fig. 4A+4B
- Wipe blade clean between passes. Fig. 4C
- When fill is very close to level with surrounding surface, wipe the balm from the repair area.
- Wrap 600 Wetordry<sup>™</sup> sandpaper around a rubber sanding block. Apply liquid Wool-Lube<sup>®</sup> ribbing lubricant to the paper and lighly sand the fill until completely level. **Fig. 5+6**
- Wipe the area dry and apply a seal directly over the burn-in fill using an E-Z Seal<sup>™</sup> pen. Allow to dry 4 5 minutes.
- Sand very lightly with 600 sandpaper (dry). Fig. 7
- Apply a coat af aerosol Clear Sanding Sealer an let dry.
- Sand lightly and remove dust.
- Apply grain using Graining Pen of the proper colour.
- Apply the correct sheen of a clear aerosol finish (Clear Toner, Ultra Classic<sup>™</sup> toner, Precatalysed Aerosol Lacquer or Finisher's Choise<sup>™</sup> lacquer.)
